Chocolate

Is toxic to pet, toxicity symptoms relates to amount and type of chocolate ingested. There is no ANTIDOT.

Regular candy

Sugar in Candy, Wrappers, and foils are potential danger to pets

Sugarless candy

It is no better, if contains XYLITOL, a content in many product like, gums, tooth paste, cookies, mouthwash Etc.

Eggs (real or fake)

Lilies are among most toxic plants to pets

Grass is mostly made of plastic, can lead to wrap around tongue or act as foreign body

Pet costumes

Never leave your pet with costume alone. Can be torn, chewed. wrap around neck
